Men below 30 years old needed



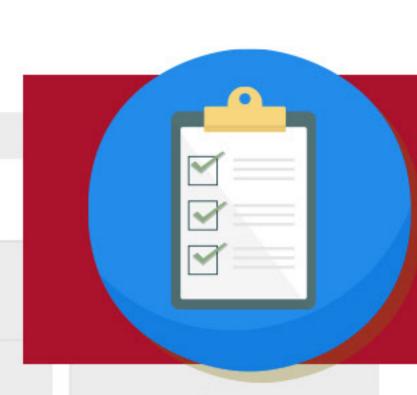

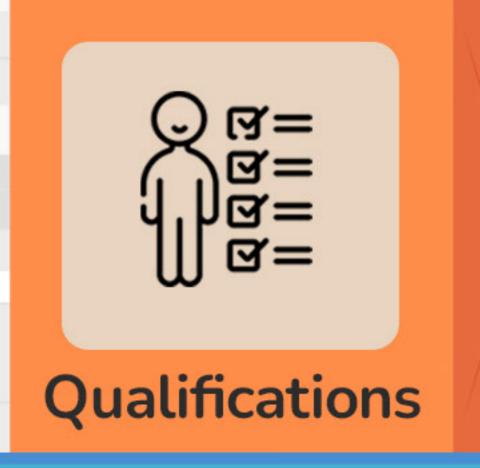

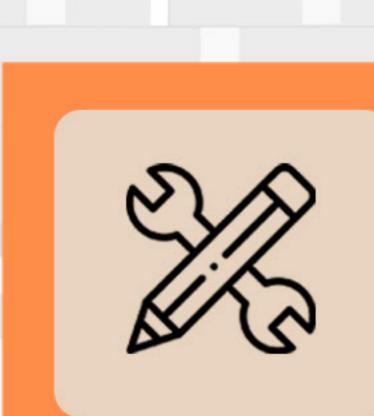

How to Write a Fair Job Ad?

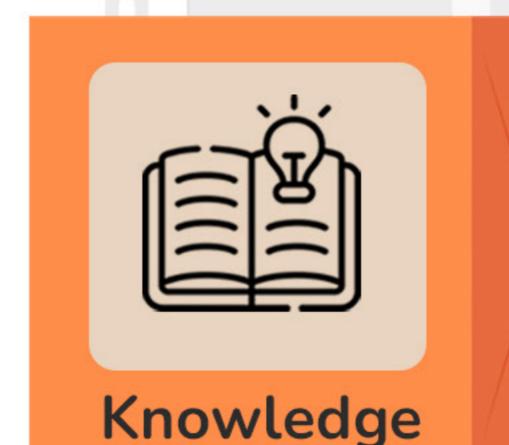


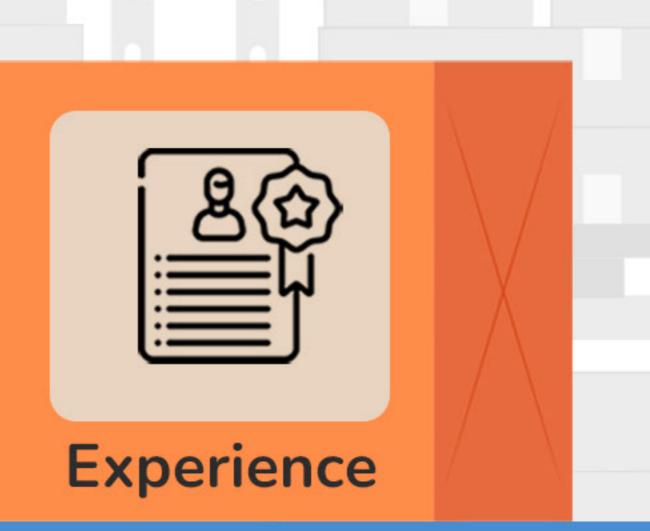
A fair job ad must ensure requirements used are based on merit and should COVER the following.

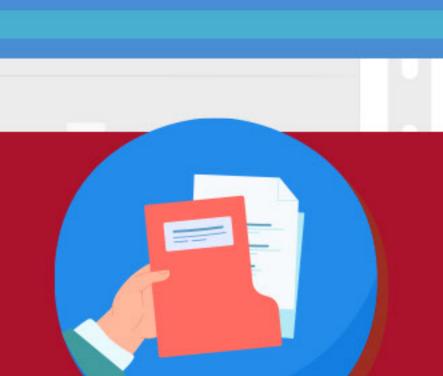




Skills







Before writing the job ad, objectively COLLECT information about what the job requires.



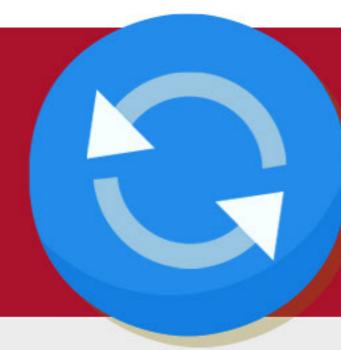
Understand the job requirements and deliverables from supervisors.



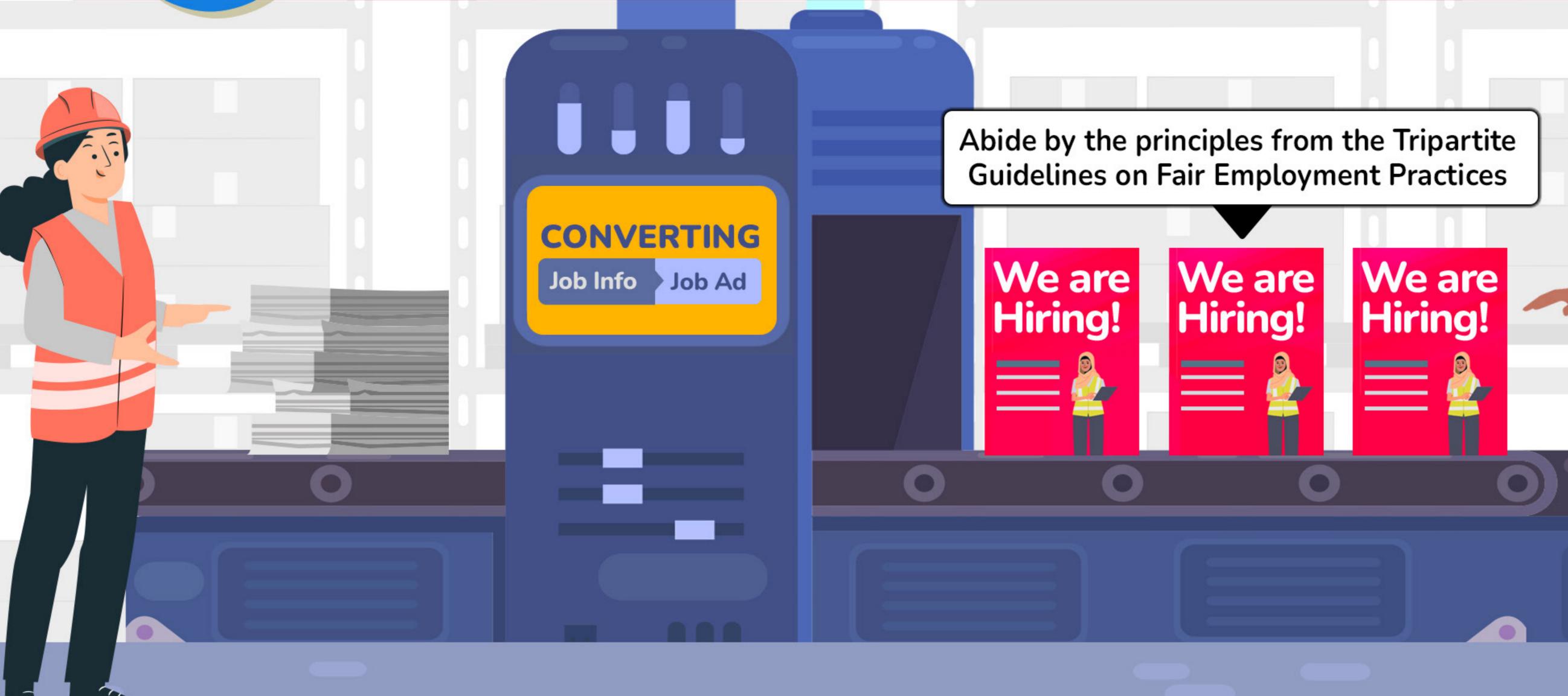
Find out from current job holders what challenges they need to overcome in their positions.



Determine performance standards, frequency, and competency for each role or task.



Upon collection, CONVERT the information into the job requirements in the job ad.



The above job ad should therefore state...

LOOKING FOR WAREHOUSE PACKER

Applicants must be able to lift and carry heavy objects (above 10kg) and work in a noisy environment.



Stating objective criteria will prevent the advertisement from being perceived as discriminatory.
