All work activities	All hazards related to work activity.	 <p>Workers are briefed on safe work procedures and job hazards during daily, weekly or monthly toolbox meetings.</p>				
All work activities	Personal injury.	 <p>Ensure that workers are equipped with the appropriate personal protective equipment.</p>				
All work activities	Poor visibility.	 <p>Workers are equipped with proper torchlights.</p>				
Usage of ladders	Toppling of ladders and/or falls from ladders.	 <p>When ladders are used, ensure that a. they are in good working condition; b. they are used on stable and level ground; and c. workers maintain three points of contact when working on the ladders.</p>				
Handling of chemicals	Exposure to hazardous chemicals.	 <p>When handling chemicals, ensure that a. workers are trained in handling chemicals; and b. Safety Data Sheets (SDS) are readily available.</p>				
Manual handling	Musculoskeletal disorders.	 <p>When carrying heavy loads, ensure that a. workers adopt the correct lifting and carrying posture; and b. work in a buddy system if necessary.</p>				
Working under hot weather	Workers may be subjected to heat and fatigue stress.	 <p>Ensure that sufficient water and rest breaks are provided.</p>				
Working at heights	Fall from heights.	 <p>Ensure that fall prevention measures are put in place before starting work.</p>				
Handling of equipment (e.g. , fogging machines, hand sprayers, etc.)	Faulty equipment (e.g. , fire, electrocution, etc.)	 <p>When using equipment, ensure that a. the equipment are properly maintained; b. workers are properly trained to handle such equipment; and c. damaged equipment is reported to supervisors.</p>
