 Strengthen WSH practices and to build a safe work culture.








- RAS has also played a part in WSH Council's effort to develop a work-atheight collateral.
 - Used as a Work-at-Height Toolkit for Supervisors.
- More can be done, and Roofing Association is working with industry stakeholders and training centres such as Global Training Centre.

- Spearhead education and certification
 - Headed by our Honorary Secretary, Mr Andy Lim of Eltraco International Group, assisted by Mr Jason Ong of Building Associates
 - To develop a work-at-height at roof level course.
 - Our vision is to have the course eventually become a Specialist Safety Orientation Course - Specially designed for working on the roof to complement the current Construction Safety Orientation Course.







- Focus will be safety while working on:
 - Installation
 - Maintenance of the roofs
 - Solar panel installation
 - Various trades that will require to access and work on the roof

- It is also important that the safety culture is ingrained in our stakeholders and workmen.
 - Workmen need to understand the importance of working at height.
 - Might have had different occupations while in their home country.
 - Might not have worked at such heights.
 - Wrong methodologies that would then be passed on from one workman to another.





Supervisors and companies will also need to adopt a positive culture towards safety.

- When RAS first met:
 - Common discussion point among roofers was that:
 - Contracts awarded to roofers, often does not include a provision for preliminary for roofers to beef up safety.
 - RAS is hoping to have discussions with the relevant stakeholders such as:
 - WSH Council
 - Singapore Contractors Association (SCAL)
 - Building Construction Authority of Singapore (BCA)

- To see how:
 - Safety preliminary cost can be included in the contract of roofers and parties who would need to work at the roof level.
 - To develop a set of guidelines for contractors to provide the necessary safety measures







- Culture shift would need to happen from the mind-set of having the cheapest contractor would need to be moved away from.
- Roofing Association Singapore hopes to be a key driver of this pivot.
- Being stake holders of any given construction or maintenance contract, we are all in this together.





- Having laid out our vision, the Taskforce formed by Roofing Association
 Singapore hopes to have the support of the community to complement our efforts to further promote work-at-height safety.
