Safety and Health Award Recognition for Projects (SHARP) Application Guidelines

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About Safety and Health Award Recognition for Projects (SHARP)

This award recognises large-scale projects or worksites that have exemplary safety and health performance, and workplace safety and health management systems. Examples of winning projects are shipyard projects, construction worksites and large projects within a company.

Applicants can only submit a single project for this category. Companies with multiple projects or worksites may apply for the Workplace Safety and Health Performance Awards (WSHPA) instead, i.e., apply for WSHPA for all projects and SHARP for a particular project.


Criteria

The criteria below represent the minimum conditions required to qualify. Fulfilling them does not mean the applicant will be awarded. The Award Panel will select the winners by assessing which applicants best fulfil the criteria. In addition, the Award Panel reserves the right to confer one Award to companies with multiple but identical applications, unless outcomes or achievements cited vary.

Qualifying period: 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022

Notable WSH Performance

- 1. No workplace accident at the project or worksite that led to fatality and major injury¹
 - For applicants with minor workplace injuries (excluding light duties), the following additional criteria applies:
 - Minimum 1.5 million manhours achieved for the project or worksite
 - **Project or worksite** injury rate must be lower than the industry injury rate (WSH National Statistics) by 12.5%

In the event that the industry injury rate is not released in time during the period of application, a 10% reduction from the previous year's industry injury rate would be a good proxy.

¹ Major injury is defined as severe injury with more than 20 days of medical leave (cumulative).

- 3. No breach² in workplace safety and health, and labour matters

Excludes COVID-19 related matters.

ConSASS 2020/ WSHMS 2020 Checklist (for Construction, Marine and Manufacturing Industry Applicants)

You are required to complete the <u>ConSASS</u> 2020/ <u>WSHMS</u> 2020 checklist. For items deemed "not applicable", you must state the reasons in the Remarks column.

Construction companies or worksites need not engage a Singapore Accreditation Council (SAC) accredited WSH auditing organisation (AO) or WSH auditor if you wish to use your ConSASS results (from Oct 2022 onwards), with a total element score of at least 70% for Band III.

1. Conduct a self-check before engaging an Auditor

Before submitting your application, please check that all criteria have been met. You may also refer to the ConSASS 2020/ WSHMS 2020 checklist.

2. Engaging Auditing Services

Please engage a SAC accredited WSH AO or WSH auditor to audit your project or worksite, with your industry under their scope. The list of SAC accredited WSH auditing organisation or WSH auditor is provided in the MOM website.

The same AO can only provide audit services for a company for up to two consecutive years. A different AO must be appointed for the third year. Each auditor is only allowed to conduct audits for up to three Award applications from the company of same UEN. For example, if a company is submitting an WSHPA and eight projects, please engage three auditors from the same/ different AO(s).

Evaluation

All applications will be thoroughly assessed. This includes verification and auditing of all submitted supporting documents, records and data. A visit to the applicant's workplace may also be requested.

Disqualification before announcement of results

An application may be disqualified if a <u>workplace accident</u> with any of the following consequences occurs before the announcement of results:

- · Fatal accident
- · Major injury accident
- Dangerous Occurrence (DO)

An application may also be disqualified if it contains inaccurate, false or misleading supporting documents, records or data, or if there is adverse reporting in the media pertaining to the applicant's or nominating company's workplace safety and health performance.

An applicant who withdraws or amends its <u>WSH Incident Report</u> and/ or an ongoing work injury claim during the period of application may be disqualified. An investigation will be conducted before the application can continue to be considered.

Notes for SAC Accredited WSH Auditors

- 1. The applicant will pay you for services rendered.
- You are required to check whether the applicants from the Construction, Marine and Manufacturing industries should apply for the WSH Performance Awards or Safety and Health Award Recognition for Projects (SHARP) before beginning to render any auditing services.
- 3. The applicant will provide you with their report and supporting documents to Consass 2020 or WSHMS 2020, and writeup for "Part 3 Section B: Evidence-Based Assessment". As an auditor, you are required to visit and verify their submitted report and supporting documents at their workplace in person.
- 4. You are required to check whether the applicant had achieved the total element score of at least 70% for Band III in the <u>ConSASS</u> 2020 or <u>WSHMS</u> 2020 checklist. You will need to input the evidence gathered and use the "Auditor's Remarks" column to take down notes or further comments that the applicant might have and allocate a score in the score card and interview sheets. For items deemed "not applicable", the auditor must verify the reasons in the "Auditor's Remarks" column.
- 5. Full virtual auditing is not allowed unless in-person interactions are restricted according to prevailing Safe Management Measures.
- 6. You are required to fully complete "Part 4: Auditor's Details and Declaration Form". Please provide your details, indicate strengths, areas for improvement and any other observations of each application, before signing off the declaration form.
