The Workplace Safety and Health (WSH) Council, in collaboration with the hotel and food and beverage associations, will be organising the WSH e-Forum for the Food and Beverage (F&B) Industry and Slips, Trips and Falls (STF) Campaign 2021 Launch on 17 June.

The e-forum provides the opportunity to hear from various F&B stakeholders on their experiences in enhancing WSH through good housekeeping, STF prevention, use of innovative technology, risk assessments and attention on staff's health.

The e-forum will also kickstart WSH Council's STF Campaign 2021. STF is one of the top contributors of workplace injuries, making up nearly half of all major injuries in 2020. It is also a major hotspot in the F&B industry. Find out what the STF Resolution is about and how companies and workers can take ownership and set aside time to manage STF risks in the workplace.

Guest-of-Honour, Senior Minister of State for Manpower, Mr Zaqy Mohamad will be delivering the opening speech and launching the STF Campaign 2021 at this event.

Inter-agency guidance on improving building ventilation and indoor air quality to reduce risk of COVID-19 transmission

As COVID-19 can be spread by aerosols in poorly ventilated, enclosed environments, the Building and Construction Authority, National Environment Agency, and Ministry of Health have come up with an updated Guidance Note for building owners and facilities managers to improve building ventilation and indoor air quality.

The updated Guidance Note sets out recommended measures for three different settings:

- For air-conditioned spaces with mechanical ventilation provision (e.g. office buildings, shopping malls)
- For enclosed air-conditioned spaces without mechanical ventilation provision (e.g. retail shops with split-unit air-conditioners)
- For naturally ventilated premises (e.g. coffee shops, markets, dormitories)

All building managers and facilities managers are strongly encouraged to follow the recommended measures to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission indoors.


Safety Starts with Me Competition 2021 winners showcase reminds all to take time to take care of their safety and health
