Ensuring COVID-19 safe workplaces

The new Workplace Safety and Health (COVID-19 Safe Workplace) Regulations 2021 have come into effect on 1 January 2022.

The WSH (COVID-19 Safe Workplace) Regulations include requirements to:

- Allow up to 50% of employees who are able to work from home, to be at the workplace at any point in time.
- Implement vaccination-differentiated access to the workplace from 1 January 2022.
- Establish a system of Safe Management Measures (SMM) to provide a safe and healthy working environment.

Most of the SMM requirements in the Regulations were enshrined in the COVID-19 Temporary Measures Control Order Regulations. The requirements were transferred to the WSH Regulations because preventing infectious disease transmission at the workplace is part and parcel of workplace safety and health. The same WSH principles and processes that apply to accident prevention should be applied towards infectious disease prevention and keeping the workforce healthy.

In this regard, the <u>Code of Practice on WSH Risk Management</u> was also updated in December 2021 to explicitly include prevention of infectious disease transmission as part of risk assessments. We remind companies to review their WSH risk assessments and make the necessary updates to mitigate the risk of infectious disease transmissions at the workplace.

Keeping workplaces COVID-safe will allow us to resume more social and economic activities sooner.
