<p>OXIDIZERS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Release oxygen easily which can cause fire and/or explosion May explode when in contact with heat, shock, friction and exposure to the environment 	<p>CORROSIVES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> May cause severe damage to body parts when in contact with this chemical 	<p>TOXICITY (SEVERE)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> May cause harmful long term health effects Degree of exposure and toxicity can affect level of health implications May be fatal
<p>ENVIRONMENTAL TOXICITY</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Has potential to cause harmful effects on the environment, people and animals Poisonous and can lead to death 	<p>GASES UNDER PRESSURE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stored in pressurised cylinders May be flammable and explosive May be harmful to health May cause oxygen deficiency if gas is leaked in an enclosed space 	<p>EXPLOSIVES SELF REACTIVES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> May cause fire, explosion or produce poisonous gas May be fatal if swallowed or if vapours are inhaled Can be toxic or corrosive Avoid contact with skin or eyes
