EXTENSION OF HEIGHTENED SAFETY PERIOD 1 MAR '23 - 31 MAY '23

The Ministry of Manpower will be extending the Heightened Safety Period from 1 Mar '23 - 31 May '23, with additional measures to complement existing ones.

Heightened alert and vigilance need to be maintained to sustain workplace safety and health (WSH) standards.



Extension of Heightened Safety Period by Three Months

MOM has extended the Heightened Safety Period by three months from 1 March to 31 May 2023, following an increase in the major injury rate. Amongst measures which the WSH Council is leading are an enhanced bizSAFE training for senior management, and the introduction of bite-sized WSH guidance materials.


